Methods – Eternal CPR

1. Matt related sharing the Gospel with asking someone out on a date. Can you relate to feeling anxious in sharing the Gospel? Should we?
2. Do you believe God typically uses relationships for advancing the Gospel? Was there one or more individual(s) instrumental in your coming to Christ?
3. How have you personally seen/experienced successful CULTIVATING?
4. How have you personally seen/experienced successful PLANTING?
5. Matt made a case for “PLANTING” ideally being a balance of acts of mercy and verbal testimony. What do you think? Has this been easy or hard for you to represent Christ to your friends through both action and conversation?
6. Do you have a “go to” method to walk someone through the Gospel? (For example Romans Road, 4 Spiritual Laws etc.)
7. Roman Road to Salvation is a progression of passages in the book of Romans which clearly walks through the Gospel. Look them up and read them as a group. Is anything missing? Would it be helpful to write these passages in our Bibles?

Matthew 11:19 (ESV) The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, ‘Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!’ Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds.”

P_____ God and His Truth into conversation.

John 4:7–15 (ESV) A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink.” **8** (For his disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.) **9** The Samaritan woman said to him, “How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?” (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) **10** Jesus answered her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.”

11 The woman said to him, “Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? **13** Jesus said to her, “Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, **14** but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.” **15** The woman said to him, “Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water.”

Romans 10:9-10 (ESV) If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. **10** For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.
