Common Objections - part 2*

- 1) How much effort have you put into getting ready to ask someone on a date? Do we put forth the same effort (and preparation) in sharing our faith?
- 2) Read Romans 1:18-20. What's the difference between general revelation and specific revelation? Are both necessary for salvation?
- 3) Read John 14:6. James contended that this is designed to be the most inclusive verse in Scripture. What are your thoughts? How would you respond to someone who suggests that there are many paths to God?
- 4) Why is it preferable to ask questions instead of arguing with a critic's position? (Read Matthew 19:16-17, 21:23-25, 22:17-21 and 41-45 for some hints).
- 5) How can we know how far to go in inviting someone to make a decision for Christ (when does it begin to feel like we are being pushy or pressuring them)? What general guidelines always need to be in place (re-read 1 Peter 3:15 if necessary!).
- 6) We certainly didn't cover all of the potential objections that we might encounter as we share the Gospel; how would you handle someone who professes belief in macro evolution, that the Bible endorses slavery or oppression of women, or someone who feels that God's word encourages homophobia? What other objections have we not covered or prepared for?
- 7) Have you encountered someone who's main objection is that the church is full of hypocrites? What is your gentle response?
- 8) James shared that some people will accuse Christianity of being a "crutch" for weak people. How would you respond to that assessment?
- 9) Have you already invited your EORD person to church this Sunday?
